

Little Free Pantry Team Charter

Purpose

The purpose of the CUUF Little Free Pantry is to maintain supplies of shelf-stable food, household cleaning products, and personal care items via an outdoor cabinet that can be accessed by those in need 24/7. Part of a larger network, the pantry is intended to fill gaps people are experiencing and to complement the food bank system.

Membership

The Little Free Pantry Team consists of at least 7 CUUF members with 1-2 alternates. Staff support is provided by the Minister and the Administrative Assistant.

Responsibilities

- Team Leads: The Lead/Co-Lead serves as a liaison to the CUUF board and to the LFP Coordinating Committee led by the First United Methodist Church. The Lead/Co-Lead also schedule team meetings and facilitate communication among the team members.
- Daily Monitoring and Stocking Members: This activity is performed daily with team members having a regularly scheduled day each week. As needed, substitutes will be arranged by the monitor for a given day and communicated to the person who does the schedule.
- Scheduling Lead: This lead develops and posts the monthly schedule that includes anticipated absences/substitutes for any days of the month.
- Purchasing Lead: This lead keeps track of priority goods in the pantry storeroom and assigns other team members to shop for them as the cash position in the pantry account allows.
- Stockroom Lead/Co-Lead: This individual(s) keeps the storerooms organized so
 that it is quick and easy for daily monitors/stockers to find the goods they need.

Reporting and Review

- The Little Free Pantry Team is part of the Ministry of CUUF.
- The Board of Trustees grants the Little Free Pantry Team decision-making authority in the use of funds donated for supplies.
- All team members share information about what is working well and what needs to be corrected to facilitate team problem solving.
- Team leads submit the annual report.
