CUUF Team Charter Highway 28 Cleanup

Purpose

The purpose of the Highway 28 Cleanup Team is to walk and pick up trash from both sides of a 2-mile stretch of Highway 28 twice a year.

Membership

The Highway Cleanup Team consists of at least 9 CUUF members or friends. The Washington Department of Transportation provides staff support to the team.

Commitment

While there are some regular participants, the activity is open to any volunteers who want to help and are physically capable of walking on level to steep terrain for 2-3 hours.

Responsibilities

- The lead picks a date, usually a Saturday morning in the spring, and reserves that date with WSDOT for the necessary equipment. Then, the lead sends emails to previous crew members and advertises the date through the CUUF newsletter/bulletin.
- The process is repeated in the fall. Since our 2-mile stretch starts on Highway 28 and goes east, we currently meet at BJ's Truck Stop parking lot to organize the day's activities.
- CUUF agrees to clean both sides of a 2-mile stretch of Highway 28 twice a year in exchange for having our name, "Cascade Unitarian Universalist Fellowship," on the Adopt-A-Highway signs posted on both sides of the highway by WSDOT.
